LEADING STONEMASON SUCCUMBS IN CITY

July 18th/26 Col.
Mr. Arthur Mortimer, Whose Funeral
Will Take Place Tuesday, Made
War-Memorial Foundation

An almost life-long resident of Victoria passed away yesterday morning in the person of Mr. Arthur Mortimer, head of the well-known monumental works on Courtney Street. Death occurred at the family residence, 1328 Carnsew Street.

The late Mr. Mortimer was born at Tacoma, Washington, forty-eight years ago, but a few weeks after his birth his parents removed to Victoria, and he had lived here ever since, receiving his education here, and subsequently entering business and associating himself with numerous local activities. He was a member of Vancouver-Quadra Lodge, A.F. & A.M., and had also been a member of the Arion Club for the past fifteen years.

Besides the widow, there survive a son and daughter; also a sister, Miss Adela Mortimer, living here.

Funeral services will be held at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church on Tuesday at 2:30, the Rev. Dr. Clay officiating, and at the graveside Vancouver-Quadra Lodge No. 2 A.F. & A.M., will take the services.

Mr. Mortimer was generally considered to be one of the finest stonemasons in the city, and one of the most important pieces of work which had been entrusted to him in the past year was the cutting of the foundation of the War Memorial in Parliament Buildings Square.

Arthur Mortimer, well-known monumental mason of Courtenay Street, passed away early this morning at the family residence, 1328 Carnsew Street. Mr. Mortimer was born in Tacoma, Wash., 48 years ago, but came to this city with his parents when he was only one month old, residing here ever since.

He was the possessor of a fine voice and for nineteen years had been an active member of the Arion Club, and for fifteen years had sung in the choir of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. He was also a member of Vancouver-Quadra Lodge, A.F. and A.M. His passing will occasion widespread regret.

The late Mr. Mortimer is survived by his widow, one son and one daughter, also a sister, Miss Adela Mortimer of this city. The remains are reposing at McCall Bros. Funeral Home and announcement of the funeral will be made later.

Adela, called "Dela", joined St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in 1888 when she was 15. For many years she was superintendent of the Sunday School; she taught Sunday School in the house at 1490 Fairfield Road. She also gave room and board to girls from Pender Island, where there was no opportunity for secondary education, until they graduated from Victoria High School.

The Mortimers had apparently been living in *Ross Bay Villa* on a lease basis. Adela purchased it in December 1921 after her father's death. City directories show that she rented the house to blacksmith John Wallace from c.1923-25. Adela moved in with her brother Arthur Mortimer, who had married Isabel Roberson in 1910 and moved into a new house at 1328 Carnesew Street in 1911. Arthur died at 49 in 1926 of what was thought to be stomach cancer. A tea-totaller all his life, Arthur drank alcohol only at the end of his life to dull the pain. Dela and Isabel lived at 1306 Yates Street during World War II and were living at 1126 Dallas Road when Isabel's daughter Rebecca "Becky" married Colonel CA Manson in 1951. They ended their days together at *Rose Manor* where Adela died at 91 on April 9, 1964. Isabel, born November 16, 1878 in London, England, was living in Vancouver when she died October 4, 1966.

Fanny Nelson (Ilven) and Walter Walmsley Shorrock were recorded by city directories as living in 1490 Fairfield by 1928, likely on a lease basis. By 1931, the Shorrocks lived on Sunrise Avenue in Oak Bay, but Fanny was registered on the land title for 1490 Fairfield on March 5, when they sold the property. Walter was born in Manchester, Lancashire, England on October 10, 1885 to William and NK (Taylor) Shorrock, and came to Canada in 1900. He worked as a civil engineer in Vancouver (one of his projects was the CPR depot) and for Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) in Kitimat and Victoria until his retirement in 1938 when he and his family moved up island. He died November 20, 1961 at 75 in Lantzville, north of Nanaimo. Fanny and Walter had two sons, Frederick Walter Hugh and William Hugh.

Stone age lives for memories

It may seem quite a jump from taking part in the six-day bicycle races of the 1950s to being proprietor of a monumental works but it seems to sit comfortably on the shoulders of Lew Rush.

"They say it's a business maxim that, unless you're going to be very big, it's better to keep your business small," he said in an interview. "And this place has been good to me."

This place is Mortimer's Monumental Works Ltd. at 633 David Street which Rush bought in 1955. He runs it with the help of Cliff Soady, a stone mason. Lew's wife, Doris, is secretary.

There were other jobs between the end of the bicycle racing and the purchase of the oldest monument works in Victoria (John Mortimer started it in 1877).

There was the realization that you don't put down roots when you're travelling the continent on the bicycle circuit and, besides, all that travelling can become pretty tiresome.

It was exciting being part of Canada's 1932 Olympics bike team under coach Torchy Peden but five years of being a pro, from 1933 to 1938, were

enough.

Rush worked for Standard Oil in Victoria and was a welder in the shipyards during the war. After the war he travelled Saskatchewan casting blankets of concrete for graves in rural cemeteries.

They kept the weeds down over the graves and, with

prenticeship in Edmonton before the war.

During the war he was a butcher in the Alberta capital and came here in 1953 to resume work as a stone mason.

He worked on the cairn for the Marilyn Bell plaque on the waterfront and for carvings in Heritage Court. The closest he's come to that type of work lately was the war memorial installed recently at Royal Roads.

The operation is fairly simple these days, Rush said. Because it costs so much to bring Canadian granite to Victoria the blank stones, already polished, come from Sweden by ship.

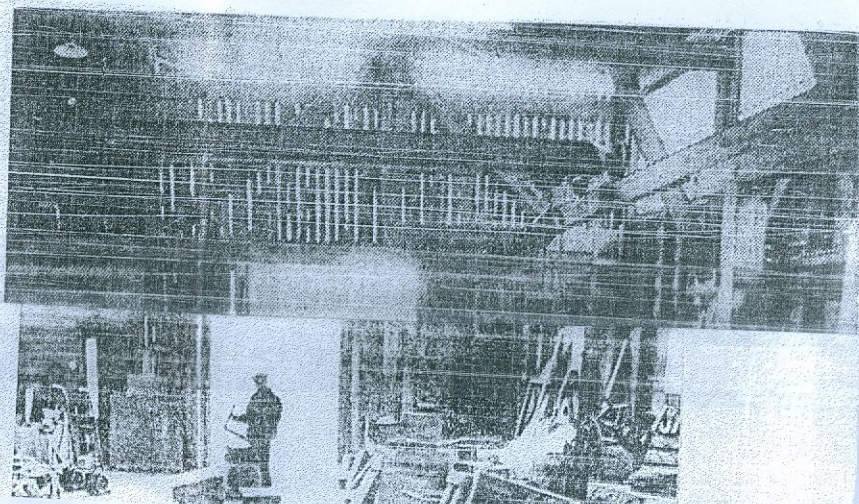
Soady spreads sheets of a rubber-like compound on the stones and cuts out the inscriptions. The stones are then put in a small room where they are blasted with steel shot. The sheets are stripped from

the stones and they are ready for installation. Sometimes the sides need a bit of trimming with a chisel.

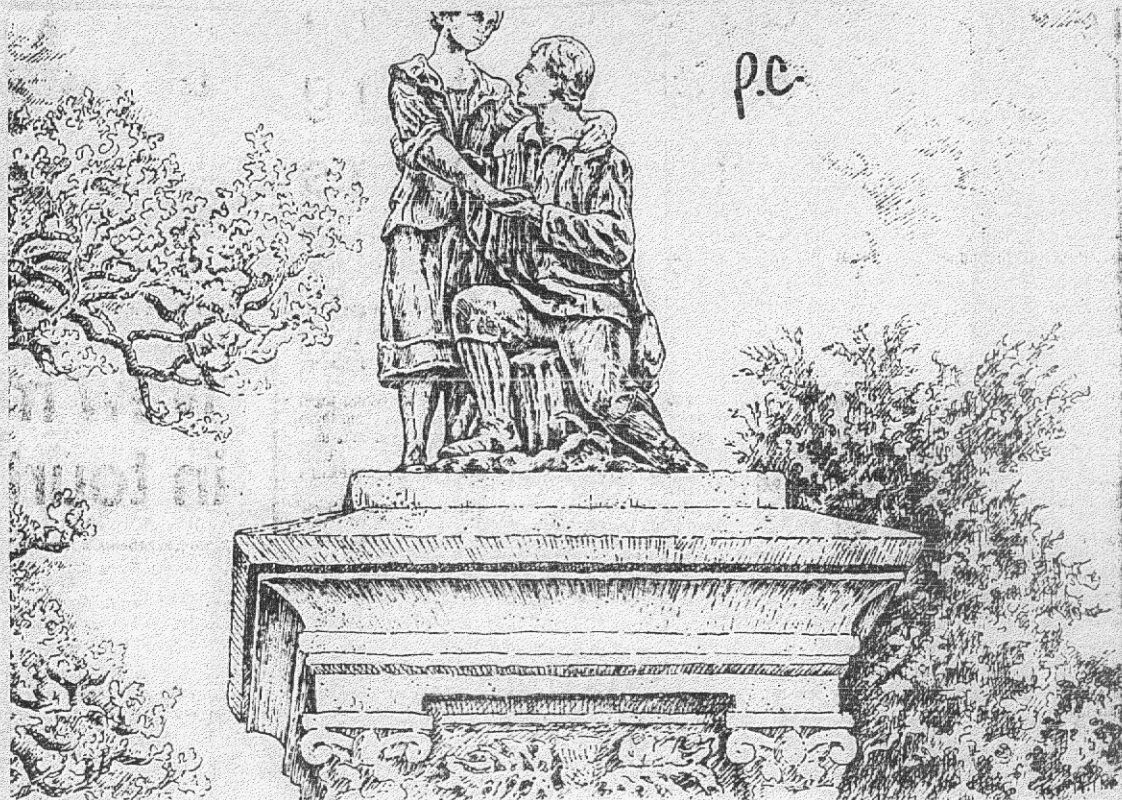
"The days of the hand chisel are gone," Rush said. "I guess it's 40 years since they were used. Even sandblasting is too slow now. The steel shot is faster. It's not as dusty and it can be swept up and used again."

"We don't even use the old carborundum saw blades anymore. They break too easily. When we need to do any cutting we use the diamond saw."

All the stones are granite these days. Marble does not weather so well. Over the years it crumbles.

Immortal, Beacon Hill Park

Robbie's Beacon Hill tribute first in Canada

Among the many commemorative features in Beacon Hill Park is the Robert Burns statue which is especially interesting at this time when the centenary of the birth of the immortal Scot is celebrated in many lands.

"Babbie," as he is often called, was born Jan. 15, 1759, in a thatched cottage at Alloway, miles south of Ayr. During his short though stormy and romantic lifetime his patriotic five poems which found their inspiration in the beauty of nature identified him forever with Scotland.

Celebrations in Victoria were recorded as early as 1860 when about 100 persons met at the Hotel Restaurant. Among those present was the publisher Amor de Cosmos who responded to a toast to "the free and enlightened press." It was at 11 a.m. when the last happy Scot left for home. In 1896, nearly 20 years after a Burns monument was erected in Glasgow, setting a precedent, the Sir William Wallace Society of Victoria and the Sir William Wallace Society of Victoria met to plan a statue in the park.

E. B. McKay, a civil engineer, designed the monument and the well-known sculptor, Hamilton MacCarthy, was commissioned to produce the figures of Robert and his great love, Mary Campbell. However, owing to a misunderstanding, the bronze figures which were cast in New York were sent to Ottawa instead of Victoria. As a result of numerous inquiries, they were found and re-routed several weeks later and were placed on top of J. Mortimer's stonework.

The unveiling ceremony took place Saturday, Nov. 10, 1900, with Lieutenant Governor Sir Henri Gustave Joly de Lotbiniere and Mayor Charles Hayward officiating. The Highland guard of honor consisted of Pipe Major A. Robertson, formerly of the Dundee Highlanders; J. R. Mackie, chairman of the Burns Memorial Committee; R. H. Jameson, wearing the Fenian raid medal of Ridgway, and John McKay, wearing medals for service at Balaklava and Sevastopol.

At the conclusion of the ceremony, the lieutenant-governor and the mayor of Victoria drank from the fountains built into the monument and the guard of honor escorted them to the waiting carriages.

Although Burns married Jean Armour, his feelings for his deceased Mary remained strong and are revealed in the enduring words of simple sweetness engraved on the granite pedestal of the statue:

*The Golden Hours on Angel Wings
Flew o'er me and my dearie;
For dear to me as light and life
Was my sweet Highland Mary.*

The statue, located north of Beacon Hill, appears to be the first in Canada to honor Robert Burns. There are now more than a hundred of these in different countries, including China and Japan, and, although it is nearly two centuries since Burns died, his memory will be preserved as long as Auld Lang Syne is sung.
