Two-storey elevation with excavated basement and rectangular plan.

An excellent example of a small masonry school in a nearly original state, this structure demonstrates more architectural skill in planning than it does in the design of detail. It features separate entrances which lead to firststorey vestibules at the opposite ends of the building. The elevation is particularly fine, consisting of a foundation in smooth masonry with battered profile, and brick walls above. The building has a chateau roofline, and the slight, central projection is surmounted by a chisel-cut gable. The roof is capped with bold cresting which repeats the profile of the dentillation under the eaves. The detailing on the transoms is unusual.
