Jackson House Settling in for Fund Drive.

Jackson House, a James Bay heritage home, as settled in at its new location at 429 Parry where it was moved recently from its former site at 522 Simcoe

So far, the Hallmark Society, which took on the project of moving and preserving the home, has raised \$6000, but another \$54,000 is needed to secure the homes future.

The lot to which the house was moved cost \$35,000 and the move another \$25,000.

Until the society can raise the rest of the money, the BC Heritage Fund is underwriting the venture.

Jackson house was built in 1901 for RB Jackson, son of pioneer Victorians.

The Hallmark Society describes the home as a "late Victorian picturesque style of residence with traces of Art Nouveau design in the exterior decoration."

The society wants to use a houseware library and meeting rooms. Donations should be sent to Jackson House Appeal, Heritage Building Foundation, PO Box 1204, Victoria, BC.
