Dear Mayor Pollen and Aldermen:

Recently about thirty residents of Battery Street, Paddon Avenue, Olympia Avenue, and adjacent Government and Niagara Streets met at one of the designated heritage homes in the area to discuss developments in our part of James Bay. A committee appointed at the meeting has drafted this letter and circulated it for signatures.

We enjoy the character of our neighbourhood and agree that existing zoning will help preserve its livability.

We appreciate the diversity of buildings now in the area, most of which enhance the streetscape. Because we have a higher proportion of designated heritage buildings than in most neighbourhoods we want to preserve the general setting for them by retaining all existing dwellings.

Spot re-zoning, particularly that which involves increasing density, is strongly opposed. The Pinehurst property at 617 Battery Street was the last piece of land re-zoned in the neighbourhood. We supported this mainly because the development will restore an important heritage building in the city, will not require existing homes to be demolished, and generally takes account of the character of the area. The future development of the Pinehurst property should be considered a unique, isolated case.

As owners and tenants we are devoting considerable time and money to maintaining and improving our homes and vards. We hope that you will continue to support existing zoning and by-laws which will encourage such positive resident actions, and assist us in discouraging developers from considering demolition, increasing density, and unsympathetic developments as alternatives to neighbourhood conservation.

We plan to continue an informal organization to monitor developments in our neighbourhood, but will also be working with the Neighbourhood Environment Committee of the James Bay Community Resources Board, and other established organizations. We look forward to future cooperation with the City of Victoria. Please call on us if we can assist you in any way.
