PERCY FOX

1877-1939

Percy Fox was born on January 4, 1877 in Bradford, Yorkshire, son of Andrew Chadwick Fox. He articulated in the Bradford office of B.W. and J.B. Bailey, Architects, 1893-98, and worked as an assistant in the same office until 1900. He established his own office in Bradford in December 1900, and designed numerous houses and business premises, including Bradford Old Bank in Leeds. In February 1911, Fox and his wife, Edith, immigrated to Canada, and he worked as office manager in **Thomas Hooper's** Victoria office until December 1911. He then went into private practice, during which time he undertook alterations and additions to a number of Victoria buildings. In 1913 Fox entered into a partnership with **Ralph Berrill**. Their styles tended toward the utilitarian for commercial buildings and an eclectic mix for residential. The "1914 Outlook" of *The Week*, January 24, 1914, declared that "they have studied the different schools of architecture, and have the faculty of adapting the various styles to modern requirements, while carrying out the ideas of the old masters of the art." Their projects included a rooming house for Kong Sin Wing in Victoria's Chinatown, 1913, and a residence in Oak Bay for Dr. Herbert Brown and real estate agent Austin Brown, 1913.

Berrill served in Europe during the First World War. After his return, he and Fox shared an office until about 1921, and then separated. Fox alone signed the plans for rebuilding three stores on Douglas Street in 1920, and for a many-gabled California Bungalow on Faithful Street for dentist, Samuel G. Clemence, in 1921. However, in 1921 Fox and Berrill together designed a side-gabled Craftsman house for George F. Carey. Fox's commercial structures included a business block on Douglas Street for Otto Weiler, 1920; alterations and

additions to the Glenshiel Inn in 1925; a woollen mill for The British Columbia Worsted Mill Limited in 1928; an apartment block on Yates, 1929, for F.G. Purser, built by the Victoria Realty and Building Company; the Bessborough Apartments on McClure Street, 1930, now Abigail's Bed & Breakfast; and several apartment blocks for building contractor John Moxam, including the Harrogate Apartments on Beach Drive in Oak Bay, 1929-30, a symmetrical Tudor Revival composition with half-timbering and facade cartouches. He also designed small structures such as the conjoint summer cottages in the seaside resort of Cordova Bay, just north of Victoria, 1931, for C.C. Johns, owner of the local general store. House designs included one for A.C. Pike, 1925; a small but notable one in English Cottage style for H.G. Graham, 1927; and one on Upper Terrace Road in Uplands, 1929, for H.B. Darnell. Percy Fox served as President of the AIBC 1927-29, and during that time frequently aired his views on the profession in the *Victoria Daily Colonist*.

Fox was a devotee of thoroughbred horse racing, and for a time was managing director of the Colwood and Willows Park race tracks. In the 1930s he became involved in the gold mining boom on the west coast of Vancouver Island, including the Privateer Mine and the settlement of Zeballos, and lived at the Windermere Hotel when he returned to Victoria. In his last year he directed the affairs of Kennedy Lake Gold Mines Limited, spending much of his time there. Percy Fox died on November 30, 1939 and was buried in Royal Oak Burial Park.

FOWLER, Charles Busted

Fowler was extremely proud of his military career and his meetings with royalty, but recorded little about his architectural career. Entry in Felstead et al, *Directory of British Architects 1834-1900*, p.322. While in Van., Fowler was a good friend of Major J.S. Matthews, and after his death his papers, including autobiographical notes and the plans of his coffin, were deposited with the CVA [Add.MSS.214]. There are additional references to Fowler in CVA Add.MSS 560; plans for the Van. Odd Fellows Hall (CVA AP-439); and correspondence regarding the 1939 Royal Visit [CVA Add.MSS.73-509-g-2-File 1]. Percy Fox, FRAIC, AIBC, was born on January 4, 1877 in Bradford, Yorkshire, son of Andrew Chadwick Fox. He articulated in the Bradford office of B.W. and J.B. Bailey, Architects, 1893-98, and worked as an assistant in the same office until 1900. He established his own office in Bradford in December 1900, and designed numerous houses and business premises, including Bradford Old Bank in Leeds.

In February 1911 Fox emigrated to Canada and worked as office manager in Thomas Hooper's Victoria office until December 1911. He then went into private practice, during which time he did alterations to the White Lunch restaurant, 1913, as well as alterations and additions to a number of Victoria buildings, and the \$100,000 Arcade Building on View Street for David Spencer.

In 1913 Fox entered into a partnership with Ralph Berrill. The firm was known as Percy Fox & Berrill. Their styles tended toward the utilitarian for commercial buildings and an eclectic mix for residences: "They have studied the different schools of architecture, and have the faculty of adapting the various styles to modern requirements, while carrying out the ideas of the old masters of the art" (*The Week*, "1914 Outlook" Edition [Victoria], January 24, 1914). Their projects included: a rooming house for Kong Sin Wing in Victoria's Chinatown, 1913; a residence for Dr. Herbert Brown and real estate agent Austin Brown, 1913, the main facade of which overlooks Oak Bay Golf Course; and an Arts and Crafts bungalow for George Percy Osler. Early in 1914 they made plans to open a branch office in Alberni, but the market was down severely, and it is likely their plans were not achieved.

Berrill left to serve in Europe in WWI. After his return, they shared an office until c.1921, then separated. Fox alone signed the plans for re-building three stores on Douglas Street in 1920, and for a many-gabled California Bungalow on Faithful Street, 1921, for dentist Samuel G. Clemence. However, in 1921 Fox and Berrill together designed a side-gabled Craftsman house for George F. Carey.

Fox continued his practice in various offices of the Brown Block throughout his career. His commercial structures included the \$350,000 David Spencer's Department Store, demolished in 1987 for the new Eaton Centre; a business block on Douglas for Otto Weiler, 1920; an apartment block on Yates, 1929, for F.G. Purser, built by Victoria Realty and Building Company; and several apartment blocks for building contractor John Moxam, including the Harrogate Apartments on Beach Drive in Oak Bay, 1929-30. Best viewed up Margate Street, it is a symmetrical Tudor Revival composition with good detailing in its half-timbering and facade cartouches. He also designed small structures such as the conjoint summer cottages in the seaside resort of Cordova Bay, just north of Victoria, 1931, for C.C. Johns, owner of the local general store. House designs included one for A.C. Pike, 1925, a small but notable one in English Cottage style for HG Graham, 1927, and one on Upper Terrace Road in Uplands, 1929, for H.B. Darnell, constructed by Williams, Trerise and Williams. Percy Fox was president of the AIBC 1927-29.

Fox was a devotee of thoroughbred horse racing, and for a time managing director of the Colwood and Willows Park race tracks. In the 1930s he became involved in the gold mining boom on the west coast of Vancouver Island, including the Privateer Mine and the settlement of Zeballos. In his last year he directed the affairs of Kennedy Lake Gold Mines Limited, spending much of his time there.

Fox's wife, Edith Victoria, also born in Bradford, came to Victoria in 1911 with her husband. They had two sons, Andrew Leslie and Edward Ferrand, both of whom worked for the *Victoria Daily Times*, and a daughter, Elaine Mary. Edith, who suffered from a lingering illness, committed suicide by hanging on October 11, 1926 at their home. Percy Fox died at sixty-two on November 30, 1939 in Royal Jubilee Hospital of cerebral thrombosis, and was buried in Royal Oak Burial Park. Contractor John Moxam was one of his pall bearers.

After an illness of several weeks, Percy Fox, well-known Victoria architect, died in St. Joseph's Hospital early this morning. He was in his 63rd year.

Mr. Fox was born in Bradford, England, where he followed the architectural profession until 1911 when he came to Victoria.

He went into the same business here, first with the firm of Thomas Hooper & Son, and later opened his own office. He designed several of Victoria's larger business blocks, including the Campbell Building, Spencer Building, Arcade Building, and Dominion Hotel.

A keen enthusiast of thoroughbred racing, Mr. Fox was associated with the sport here during the post-war revival and for a period was managing director of the Colwood and Willows Park race tracks.

FOX—There passed away this morning at St. Joseph's Hospital, Percy Fox of 1715 Hampshire Road. The late Mr. Fox, who was 62 years of age, was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, England, and had resided in this city for the last 28 years.

He was a member of the B.C. Architects' Institute, and his passing will be keenly felt by a very wide circle of friends. There survive his passing one daughter, Mrs. W. F. Lloyd, 1715 Hampshire Road; two sons, Leslie, at 1039 St. David Street, and Edward F., of 1790 Beach Drive; also two brothers, Frank, residing at Bradford, England, and Dundas, in London, England; also four grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon, at 2:30 o'clock, from the parlors of the S. J. Curry & Son Funeral Home, with the Rev. H. St. J. Payne officiating.

During Fox's tenure on the Coast he helped to develop one of the most rapid developments in the province.
