

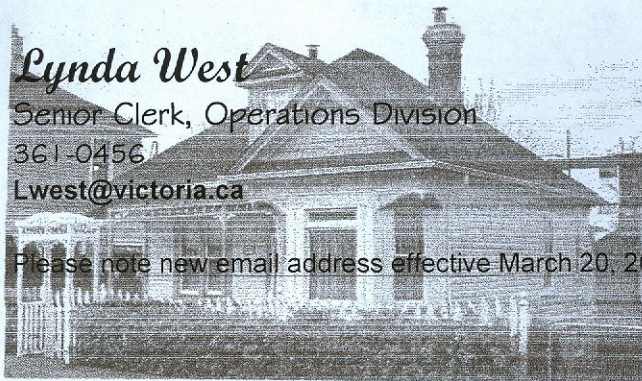

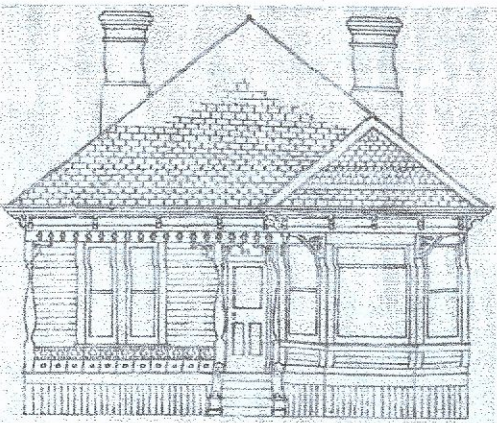

The general configuration of this vernacular house, with its 1½ storeys, steep front-gabled roof, inset corner porch, and front bay window, is similar to the Edwardian

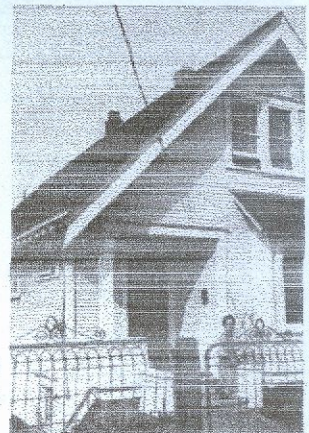

Vernacular Arts & Crafts type popular prior to WWI, although this lacks dormers. Wide eaves with exposed raftertails, bargeboards with notched ends, and a shed roof on the front box bay window are typical of the Craftsman style of Arts & Crafts. There are box bays on both sides. A detached garage (also designated heritage) lacks Craftsman features but has a shallow-pitched front-gabled roof. The walls of both are covered with double false-bevel drop siding.

In 1912 Joseph Le Sueur built 1280 Walnut for Ephraim B. & Harriette A. Kirkbride, newly-arrived from Australia. Ten years later Le Sueur built 1276 Walnut for son William A. Kirkbride and wife Elizabeth (Batey). Ephraim and sons William and Albert all worked with BCER. Following Ephraim's death in 1939 at 76, Harriette and son Ephraim continued to live in 1280 until close to her death in 1951 at 80. William and Elizabeth sold 1276 about 1940. They died in Victoria, Elizabeth at 68 in 1953 and William, who had remarried and had been a street car conductor for 40 years, died at 90 in 1978.

The second family to own 1276 Walnut were Harry and Annie Wilby, from about 1940. Henry A. Wilby, born in 1899, was a second generation Victorian, as his grandfather Henry E. Wilby landed in Esquimalt in 1859 and father William was born here in 1862. Harry was an auto mechanic with such companies as Begg Motors and Wilson Motors and later worked in sheet metal.

Harry married Annie Waterhouse in 1928 at First United Church. They received silver flatware from Begg Motors staff, a silver casserole from Stocker's Ltd staff where Annie worked, and a mantle clock from Mr and Mrs C. Stocker. Annie died in 1958 at 56 leaving Harry with three young children. He remarried in 1965 to Mary Millan, a divorcee who lived at 1256 Walnut.

Mary, born Mary Ralph Peters in Maple Creek, SK, in 1912, moved to Victoria in 1937. She worked as a waitress and married Frank Millan in 1939. He went off to fight during World War II and Mary became a "Rosie the Riveter" in the Boeing aircraft plant here in Victoria. She lived on Walnut, first at 1264, from the early 1940s.

Harry Wilby died in 2000 and Mary moved into the Aberdeen Hospital in 2002. Her daughter Bev sold the house to neighbours who live in Joseph Le Sueur's own house at 1272 Walnut.

Bill for Legislatures

Dr. Pidgeon then discussed at con-
siderable length the legal instrument

fect to union, namely, the bills which
will be submitted to the Federal
