DIED SUNDAY AFTER LENGTHY ILLNESS

Was Leading Industrialist
Until Retirement; Resident
Thirty-nine Years Here

After an illness of over five years' duration, John Raymond, widely-known resident and formerly a leading figure in the industrial life of the city, passed away yesterday at the family residence, 419 Belleville Street. Mr. Raymond had been in feeble health since he suffered a paralytic stroke five and a half years ago, but the news of his death will occasion much regret among a wide circle of friends. He was eighty-two years of age.

A native of Guernsey, Channel Islands, Mr. Raymond came to Canada when a young man of twenty-five. He established a business in London, Ontario, and achieved success there for eighteen years until the call of the West brought him to Victoria. Arriving in this city in April, 1886, he started in a very small way as a manufacturer of lime and builders' supplies.

The business prospered under his able, shrewd guidance until it subsequently became one of the leading commercial undertakings in Victoria, with lime works at Shawnigan Lake and Esquimalt.

In January, 1911, Mr. Raymond sold the business to Evans, Coleman & Evans of Vancouver, and retired into private life. He retained to his death,

PIONEER VICTORIA RESIDENT SUCCUMBS

Mr. John Raymond, Formerly Leading Industrialist Here, Dies at Age of Eighty-Two

Mr. John Raymond, a widely known resident and formerly a leading figure in the industrial life of Victoria, passed away at the family residence, 419 Belleville Street, on Sunday afternoon, following an illness of over five years' duration. The late Mr. Raymond was born eighty-two years ago in Guernsey, Channel Islands, and has resided in Victoria for forty years. The intelligence of his death will be received with regret among a wide circle of friends.

Coming to Canada when a young man of twenty-two years, Mr. Raymond settled in London, Ontario, where he established a successful business, and remained in that enterprise for eighteen years. He then heard the call of the West, and travelled westward until Victoria was reached. Here he made his home until the time of his death.

Arriving in this city in April, 1886, Mr. Raymond began business here as a manufacturer of lime and builders' supplies. This business continued under his direction to prosper, until it subsequently became one of the principal commercial achievements in Victoria, with lime works at Esquimalt and Shawnigan Lake.

Retires From Public Life in 1911

Mr. Raymond, in January, 1911, sold his business to the firm of Evans, Coleman & Evans, and retired from public life. He established twenty-six years ago Raymond Wharf on Belleville Street, the proprietorship of which he retained until the date of his decease. Mr. Raymond formerly owned a considerable portion of James Bay, but sold much of it, including part of what is now occupied by the C.P.R. docks.

The deceased is survived by four daughters, Mrs. W. B. Shakespeare, Mrs. Walter Luney and Mrs. S. R. Goodacre, of Victoria, and Mrs. C. F. Davie, wife of the Provincial member for Cowichan-Newcastle riding, Duncan, and one son, Mr. Percy A. Raymond, of Victoria, and eighteen grandchildren. His wife predeceased him about seventeen years ago.

The funeral will be held tomorrow at 2 o'clock from the B.C. Funeral Chapel, Broughton Street. Interment will take place in Ross Bay Cemetery

however, the proprietorship of the Raymond wharf on Belleville Street, which he established twenty-six years ago.

At one time he owned considerable property in the James Bay district but sold much of it, including part of that which is now occupied by the C.P.R. docks.

Essentially a home-loving man, the late Mr. Raymond was frequently approached by leading citizens anxious to enlist his business acumen and integrity in the interests of public life, but he steadfastly refused all

inducements, including that of a nomination for the maycralty. His home, too, proved a stronger attraction than club life, and until the day of his death his chief recreation and pleasure was found in family life. His wife predeceased him about seventeen years ago, and he is survived by four daughters and one son, Mrs. W. B. Shakespeare, Mrs. Walter Luney and Mrs. S. R. Goodacre of Victoria; Mrs. C. F. Davie, wife of the Provincial member for Duncan, and Percy A. Raymond of Victoria, also eighteen grandchildren. The funeral will be held from the B.C. Funeral Chapel on Wednesday at 2 p.m. Interment will be made in Ross Bay Cemetery.
