In the late 1890's, two German businessmen each bought 10 acre parcels of land from Bill Richardson. Ludiwg Hafer erected a summer home for his family. It is not known whether A. Schnoter built on his property.

Rubin Randall, a federal plant inspector, resided here in the 1920's. The house is typical of the period, being of the Bungalow Style. It is basically a rectangle, gable-roofed except for a shed dormer over the main entrance, which is through an open (now glazed) inset porch.

The residence is situated on the edge of a hollow close to Shady Creek, and being down a long private lane, is not visible from the roadside.
