The Mellor Building, designed by C. Elwood Watkins, went up in 1912, just to the east of the Royal Theatre, and was listed as a "new building" in the 1913 city directory. George Mellor of Mellor Brothers, purveyors of paints, oils, wallpaper etc. was the owner, and one of the first companies in the building was the Dominion Automobile Association, with employees Benjamin S. Cannon, Keith W. Macrae and William W. Stephens.

Mellor Apartments appeared in the city directory in 1921 and they were there until 1980, when the building was acquired and restored by CFX Radio. Mellor Apartments began as seven units, then became eight units in 1929 increasing again to nine in 1941. All the apartments were on the upper floor, with various businesses at ground level.

In 1919 the Mellor Brothers retail business was listed at 819 Broughton and this is the first appearance of this street number in the directories. Presumably the business occupied the ground floor with the apartments above. At this time there were various businesses and people occupying 825 Broughton. Mellor Brothers stayed at 819 Broughton for many years but then moved to 1028 Blanshard, after which the company appears to have gone out of business. 819 Broughton became Gibson's Studio Photography in 1952 and this business stayed there until the change of ownership in the late 1970s. After the 1980 restoration the building seems to have been re-numbered with 819 no longer being used. Broughton Communications were at 823, along with Monday Publications, Trade Typesetting and Real Estate Victoria. CFX Radio was at 825 Broughton by 1984 with the remainder of the building as offices for B.C. government departments. Later occupants were a firm of lawyers and a mortgage company.

CFX Radio moved out early in 2008 and the building is now owned by the Nature Conservancy of Canada.

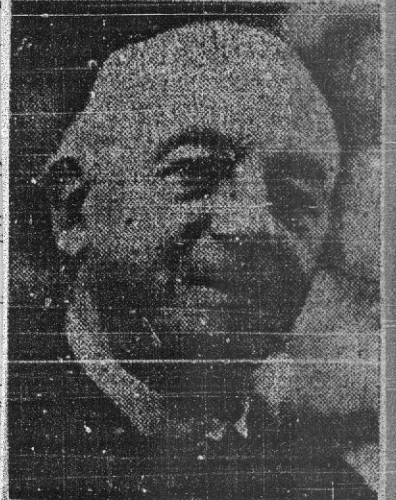
