HERITAGE **UPDATE** 

-Permits have been taken out to renovate 546 PANDORA AVENUE (next to Fan Tan Alley)....The City will soon be selling the heritage house at 2130 RIDGE (it is to be designated first) ...an offer from the owners of 1108 PANDORA to relocate their house to one of the "heritage" lots at 1133 Catherine St. has been accepted by the City...

-Good news for SOUTH PARK SCHOOL GRADS AND SUPPORTERS. School Board has announced it will spend \$50,000 to repair and paint the exterior of both buildings with another \$100,000 earmarked for interior repairs and restoration in the near future. The work is long over due for this historic Evidently the work was justified on the basis of the increased enrollment from an area that was not expected to need these facilities and not from a new awareness of the importance of heritage. However it came about we are pleased it is happening and are further encouraged that the work is being co-ordinated with a committee of parents, teachers, City Hall reps and the B.C. Heritage Conservation Branch.

- -The HERITAGE ADVISORY COMMITTEE Victoria City Hall had a busy year. Of the 300 listed heritage houses in Victoria, 200 were reviewed, and of these approximately 2/3 were recommended to be upgraded to designation status. For various reasons only about 25 homeowners agreed to have their homes designated, which allows them to qualify for financial assistance on exterior or structural repairs. In addition, the reprinting of this Old House was organised and two demolition permits were reviewed (655 Niagara and 727 Yates).
- -Hallmark has recently added to its collection a set of Samuel Maclure drawings for HATLEY PARK (Royal Roads). Our archival records are being reorganized and expanded to provide better facilities for old books, photos and plans of historic interest injour area. - -The upcoming HERITAGE FESTIVAL is shaping up to be the major Festival of the year. We will be asking for volunteers to man our booth and help with some of the organization. More information next newsletter....



MEMBERSHIPS

SAANICH

-The Heritage Advisory and Archival Committee has received \$2,900 from the B.C. Heritage Trust for a photographic survey of heritage buildings in the municipality. The money will be spent on photographs of 58 buildings; the photos will be stored in the municipal archives. Several homes are in the process of being formally designated as heritage sites under a municipal law.

-SAANICH AWARENESS PROGRAM: Grade 4 & 5 students are participating in projects to become more aware of the Saanich heritage. Two winners from each school will have lunch with the Mayor.

-On Monday February 18, 1985, Saanich Council will proclaim Heritage Week. Some houses may be designated at this time. As well there will be a display at the K Mart Mall during this week.

WESTERN HERITAGE ADVISORY GROUP

-The Western Communities Heritage Advisory Group is trying to mount COMMUNITIES some interest in the old Colwood Golf Clubhouse. It is now vacant and was last used by the Juan de Fuca Hospital under lease from the Ministry of Health. It is quite probable that this was the clubhouse that King Edward VIII used when he played there.

-The Caleb Pike Farmhouse is now being used for some community events, but more money will be needed to complete the chinking and add a wood stove before the building is suitable for winter meetings. Depending on the amount of money available, plans are to include a small kitchen, to convert the dairy on the property to washrooms, and to build a caretaker's cottage of logs. The caretaker presently lives in a trailer on the property.
